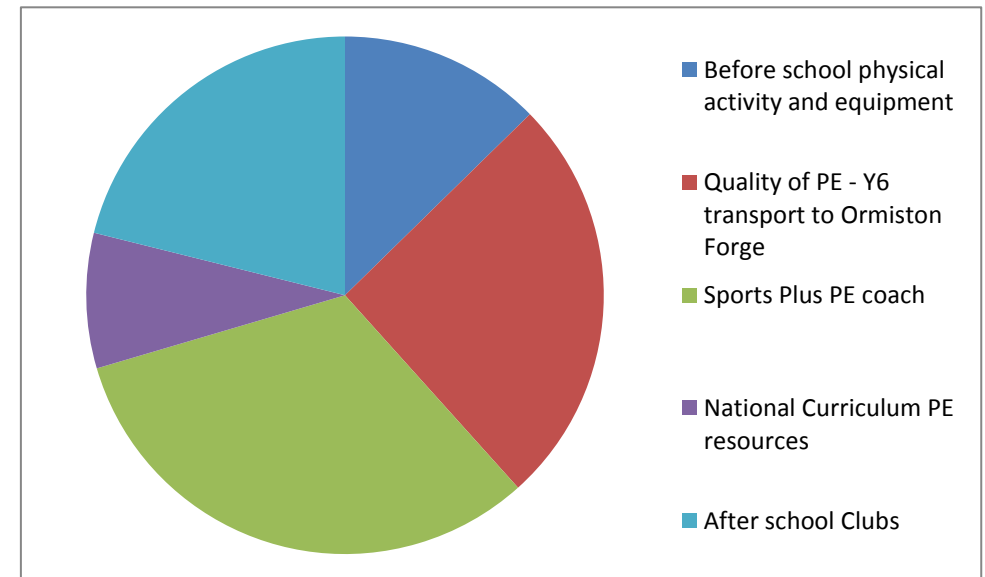

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Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport.

Possible uses for the funding might include for 2016-2017:

- Supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs- after school clubs.
- Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sports coaches.
- Creating sustainable PE program.
- Running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games.
- Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs (use of school for parents clubs)
- Using professional sport facilities and professional coaching in to allow outdoor adventure sports to take place.
- Creating new sport curriculum through other sports for example sailing center and other sports.
- Support travel for schools sports teams.
- Create a community sport training program.
- Aiming for schools game mark and aiming Kite Quality Mark
- Promoting local sporting actives and companies.

This year, our school will receive two payments totalling £8910: a payment of £5198 will be collected in November followed by £3712 in April. The following summary provides further information on how this money will be spent at Corngreaves Academy.
